



Wycoller Country Park

Wycoller Country Park is one of the prettiest Country Parks in Lancashire.

The area is famous for its association with the Brontë sisters who referred to many of the nearby landmarks in books such as "Wuthering Heights" and "Jane Eyre". The exclusion of cars from the village and the attractive appearance of the many preserved old buildings creates a unique feeling of tranquillity which is rarely experienced today. The Country Park has many footpaths leading to local beauty spots which include View Point Rocks', near Bank House and Wycoller Beck. Disabled toilet facilities are provided within the Country Park as well as an information centre at the Aisled Barn.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

The railway terminates at Colne with a regular service from Burnley, Accrington, Blackburn and Preston. Burnley and Pendle Joint Transport run an hourly bus service from Burnley, Nelson and Colne, stopping at Laneshaw bridge and Trawden and an hourly National Express Coach service is available between Colne and Keighley stopping at Laneshaw Bridge. It is then a one and a half mile walk by public footpaths to Wycoller.

MAP & Directions

Wycoller is located approximately 4km east of Colne and may be approached from a number of directions. Via the A65 through Burnley, Nelson and Colne; the A6068 from Keighley; the A59 from Skipton or the old road from Haworth to Laneshaw bridge.

Directions to Trawden Road Car Park

1. The M65 ends at Junction 14, Colne. At the roundabout take the first turning along Vivary Way.
2. Travel straight on at the traffic lights.
3. You next reach an 'island' with a public house on it. At this large roundabout take the 2nd turning (the first is divided into two) to continue travelling in the same direction as you were before reaching the island. You should now be on North Valley Road.
4. Straight on at the traffic lights, passing Langroyd Road to continue along Windsor Street.
5. At the traffic lights continue straight on to pass Skipton Road, you should now be on Byron Road.
6. The Road veers right to a large roundabout. Take the second turning to go along Keighley Road, but get into the middle lane almost immediately after leaving the roundabout.
7. Turn right down Cotton Tree Lane towards Trawden. From here on follow all signs that announce "Wycoller Country Park".
8. Drive along Trawden Road, then Skipton Road, before you take a very sharp hand left turn up Keighley Road and the terrace called Rock Lane.
9. The road passes Trawden Recreational Ground, but before you leave the Ground behind, take a right hand turn to Wycoller.
10. Park at Trawden Road Car Park. Please note that only authorised users of Pepper Hill Barn, disabled badge holders, residents and trades people are permitted to drive down into the hamlet of Wycoller.



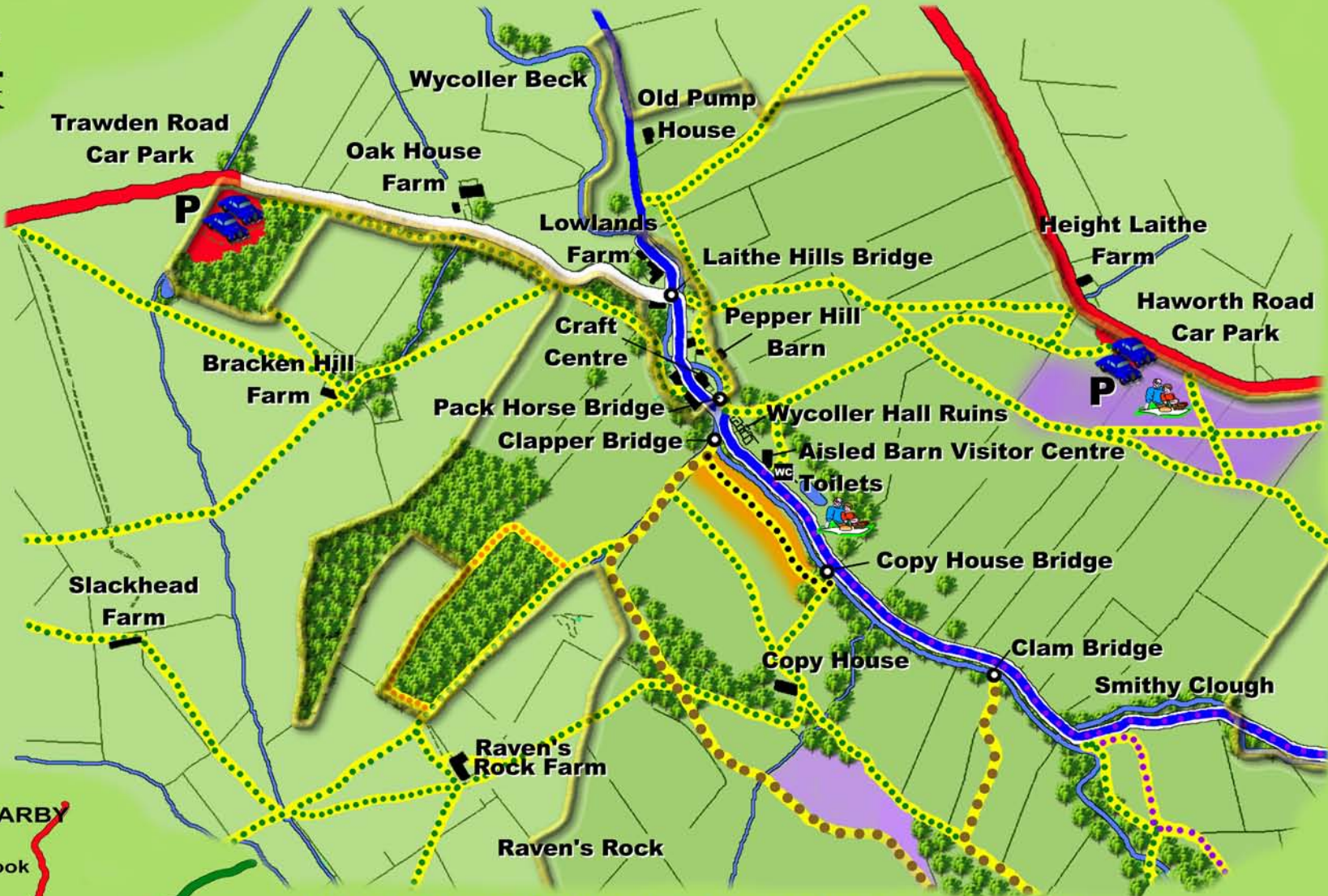

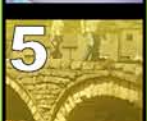
